EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS WEEK

May 3–9, 2026 is the Emergency Preparedness Week on Prince Edward Island—part of a nationwide annual initiative that encourages residents to be ready for emergencies such as storms, floods, and wildfires. The week highlights the importance of building emergency kits, creating family emergency plans, and understanding local risks to strengthen our individual and community resilience.

While municipal emergency planners, the Morell Fire Department, other first responders, volunteers, and our provincial partners stand ready to respond, residents also play a vital role in emergency preparedness.

Residents are encouraged to assemble a 72-hour emergency kit that includes essentials such as water, non-perishable food, a battery-powered radio, and flashlights. It is also wise to keep your vehicle's gas tank at least half full and ensure cell phones are fully charged. Pet owners should remember to include food and supplies for their animals as well.

Families should teach children what to do in an emergency and ensure they know their home civic address. Taking the time to review your home insurance policy can help you better understand available coverage in the event of property damage.

Individuals with specific medical needs, such as those requiring oxygen or other medical equipment, should consult their healthcare provider to confirm what supplies or arrangements may be necessary during an emergency.
